Dear Parents and Guardians,

Due to the high percentage of students eligible for free meals in Junction ISD, our school (K-12) will be participating in the "Community Eligibility Program" starting this year. What this means for you is that ALL students, regardless of income, will be receiving free meals at breakfast and at lunch.

This provision has made it possible for us to serve Breakfast in the Classroom at the Elementary level. All students K-5 will be offered a breakfast but they are not "required" to take one.

MS athletics will still be able to get breakfast before 2nd period. The cafeteria will be open in the mornings starting at 7:30 for all MS and HS students who want breakfast. (Elementary will go to the playground, weather permitting, not the cafeteria.)

Along with these meal changes, we will now be selling more a la carte items and snacks in the cafeteria. Students may use their cafeteria funds to purchase these items as long as they have money in their accounts or they may purchase them with cash. There will be NO CHARGING on their accounts. Some of the items available include chips, crackers, snack mix, beef jerky, cookies, soft pretzels, bread sticks, juice, ice cream and other frozen treats.

For those of you who are helping to support the "Elementary Assistance" account, please be assured that your funds will only be used for extras from the menu meal items. And THANK YOU for your help!
